The purpose of the Summit was to bring together key stakeholders in the US physics enterprise to form a coalition of university, corporate, government and professional society partners to advocate for effective policies, programs and practices to achieve a diverse physics workforce.



The annual Conference brings together over 500 African American and Hispanic American physics students and professionals, who present results and discuss topics ranging from Acoustics and Women in Physics to Physics GRE Tutorials and Success in Graduate School.
